

Guidelines for International Students' Entry/Re-entry into Japan

Regarding international students' travel to Japan, please ensure the following conditions are fulfilled and prepare for your travel to Japan.

[Checklist: International Students' Entry into Japan (Prior to Entering Japan)]

- ①The country of your departure or transit country(s) are not included in the denial of landing subject countries/regions specified by the Japanese government.
- ②You can obtain a visa for Japan.
- ③In the departure country, there are no travel restrictions, etc. and flights to Japan are available.
- ④If you are using a connecting flight(s), you are not subject to travel restrictions such as refused entry in the transit country(s).
- ⑤After entering Japan, you have ensured means of transportation other than public transportation to move from an airport to your place of residence/accommodation.
(For permitted means of transportation, please refer to [Checklist: Must Follow Upon Entering Japan] section below.)
- ⑥You have secured a place of residence/accommodation in which you can self-quarantine for 14 days as soon as entering Japan
- ⑦You understand and agree to the following: after entering Japan, if you have troubles returning to your country (for example, flights are unavailable or entry restrictions are placed in the transit country(s), etc.), all additional expenses for your stay (living expenses, or extra fares due to an abrupt price change of your return flight fare, etc.) occurred in this case are borne by the students.

[Checklist: Must Follow Upon Entering Japan]

If entering Japan from overseas/returning to Japan from overseas, regardless of the nationality of the traveler and traveler's departure country/region, you must follow 1. to 3. listed below.

1. Upon arriving at an airport in Japan, do not use public transportation to move to your place of residence/accommodation.
 - ※ After consulting with your supervisor and prior to leaving the departure country, secure means of transportation other than public transportation.
 - ※ Vehicles belonging to the "vehicle for hire" companies introduced on the Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare of Japan web page below can be used as a means of transportation from an airport to your place of residence /accommodation.
(Please note that ordinary taxis are not permitted to be used as a means of transportation.)

2. After arriving in Japan, self-quarantine in your place of residence/accommodation for 14 days. Refrain from going outside unless absolutely necessary.
During the self-quarantine period, minimize contact with other people as much as possible.
3. If you have symptoms such as a high fever, cough, difficulty in breathing, immediately call TUAT Health Center for consultation. (TUAT Health Center: 042-367-5548/5189)
